

## The York BID Company Ltd. Membership Information & Rules

All levy paying businesses can register to become a voting member. This entitles businesses to:

- Vote during Annual General Meetings (AGMs) and Extraordinary General Meetings (EGMs)
- Join the York BID Board of Directors

To become a member, you must nominate a named representative within your company. This representative will then be authorised to vote on behalf of the company during AGMs and EGMs. Representatives must hold a management position or higher and have completed the online survey <u>HERE</u>. Voluntary members are not eligible to vote.

## **MEMBERSHIP RULES**

- 1. Every BID Levy Payer is eligible to become a voting member. Voluntary members are not eligible to become voting members.
- 2. Businesses can only nominate <u>one named representative</u> to act as a voting member on behalf of the business. This also applies to businesses occupying multiple properties.
- 3. To become a voting member, a levy payer must complete the online <u>Registration</u> <u>Form</u>.
- 4. To become a voting member, the business must have paid their levy dues in full.
- 5. Members must work in the best interests of York BID, its members and objectives, making decisions based on merit and evidence and avoiding bias or conflicts of interest.
- 6. Rules set out in the BID Company <u>Articles of Association</u> and the Companies Act 2006 relating to the conduct of members/directors will apply.
- 7. Registered members can formally apply to become a Board Director. This is subject to there being a vacant position on the Board in accordance with items 24.1-24.7 in the York BID Company Articles of Association (Retirement and Rotation of Directors).
- 8. Members will not be eligible to stand for the position of Chair unless they have served a minimum of a year as a Board Director.
